

Community-Engaged Scholars Faculty Fellows Program 2022 Application

The Center for Service-Learning and Social Action is pleased to announce the 2022 Community-Engaged Scholars - Faculty Fellows Program.

<u>Purpose</u>: The intent of this **two-year faculty development program** is to create a community of scholars who will develop, build upon, or produce Community-Engaged Scholarship (CES), specifically through the following program goals:

- Develop faculty capacity for community-engaged teaching, learning and scholarship through a community-engaged scholarly project (may include current research agenda)
- Facilitate a supportive faculty community around community-engaged scholarship
- Coordinate faculty peer feedback on the community-engaged scholarly project
- Complete, disseminate, and submit the community-engaged scholarly project for publication

Stipend:

A stipend of \$3,500 will be awarded per year for successfully meeting the expected outcomes and create courses that incorporate a significant component of civic engagement and service-learning into the course curriculum.

Community-engaged courses and service-learning courses will take many different forms, but they will all:

- Involve mutually beneficial collaborations with a community partner or partners
- Engage research and/or teaching to address a specific need, problem, or common concern in the community through your discipline
- Incorporate the values, skills and knowledges of community engagement in ways that enhance academic rigor
- Promote the interrelationship of knowledge and experience through theory, action, research, and reflection
- Work with partners primarily in the St. Clair/Superior and Hough communities.

Criteria:

- Clearly articulated interest in, demonstrated commitment to, and pursuit toward community-engaged teaching, learning, and research.
- A well-conceived and clearly-defined rationale for community-engaged learning
- A well-defined plan for teaching the course in the next academic year
- A description of the development of a collaboration with a community partner
- Addressing how community-engaged learning will work synergistically with efforts to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion
